

Applications for Temporary Guardianship Orders, Permanent Guardianship Orders AND Initial Custody must be made within 2 days of apprehension or the child is returned. During this time, the child is in Interim Custody of the Director of Children's Services.

**Director** - A government worker who investigates child protection matters and makes Court applications under the Child, Youth and Family Enhancement Act

Apprehension Order - Allows Children's Services or a Peace Officer to apprehend a child

**Supervision Order** - Provides terms that must be followed in order to keep a child safe and allows Children's Services to supervise and visit the parent or guardians home unannounced

**Temporary Guardianship Order** - Directs a child to be brought into temporary care of Children's Services, Guardianship is shared with Children's Services

**Permanent Guardianship Order** - Directs a child to be brought into the permanent care of Children's Services, this Order ends the rights of other guardians
